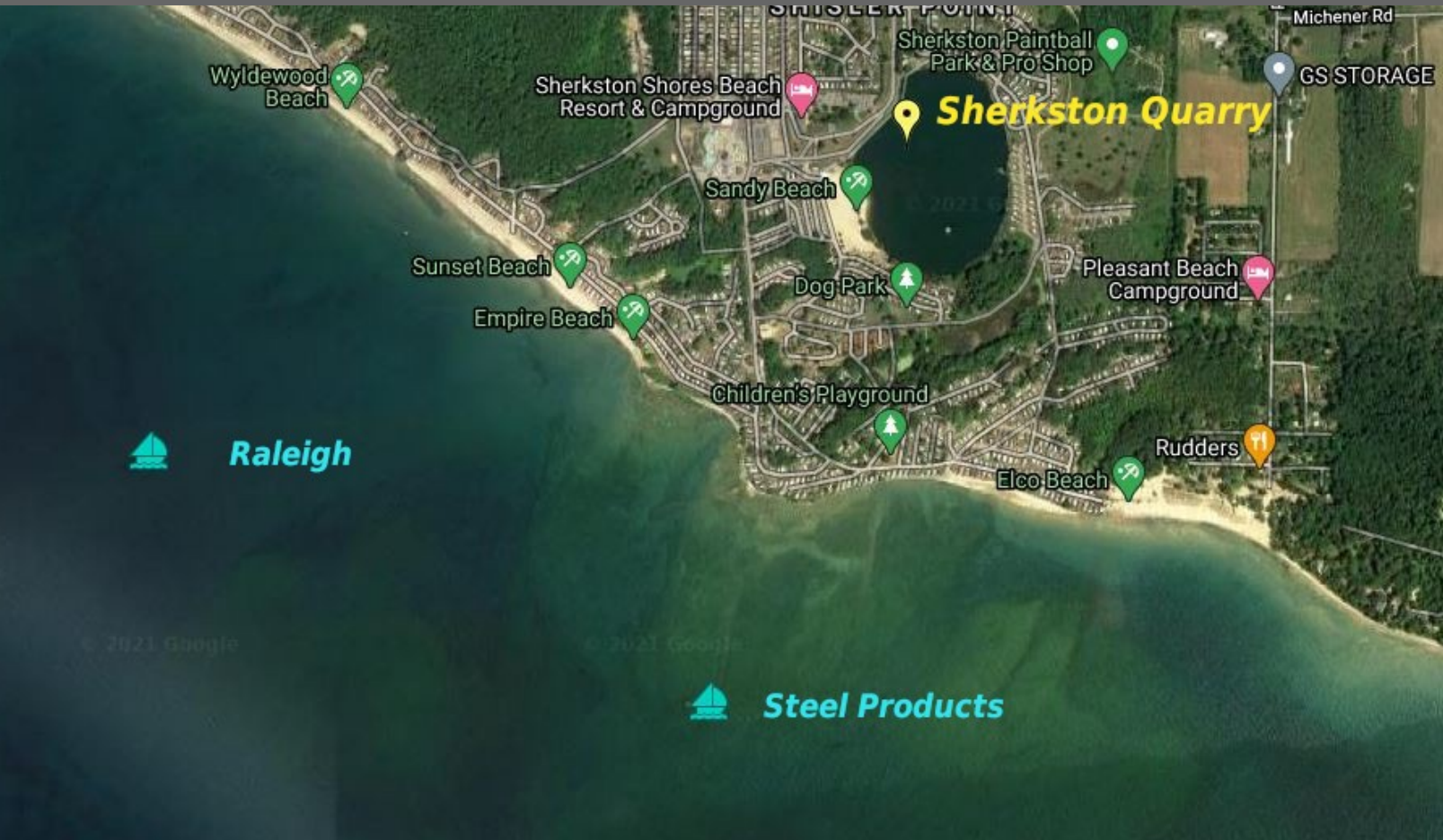


# Sherkston Shores



## Sherkston Quarry:

At Sherkston Quarry you can enjoy the 27-acre spring fed quarry, exploring remnants of a hundred-year-old quarry mining operation on the quarry floor.

Visibility ranges from 5'-40', but tends to be better in the cooler spring and fall. Following the old tracks you can find ore cars on the spur lines. Depths to 35ft make it suitable for all divers.

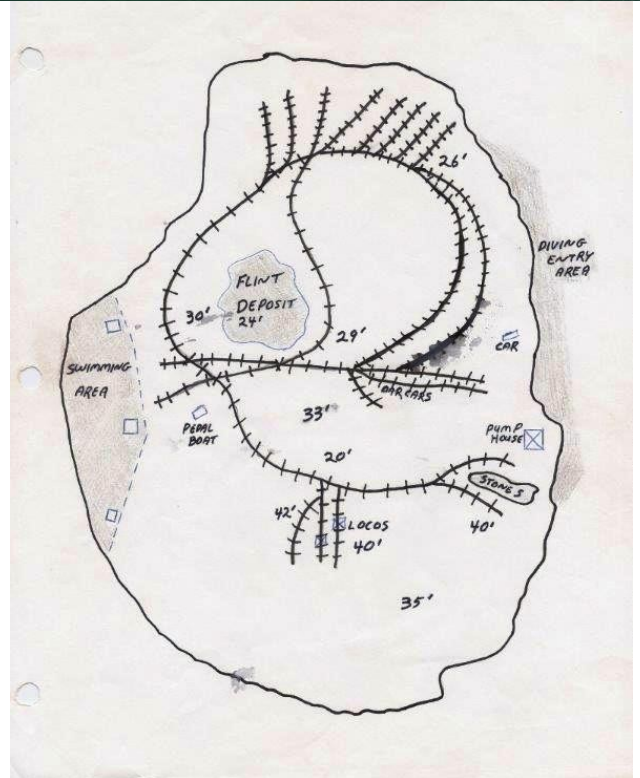
## The Raleigh:

Visit the 235 ft Wooden Freighter Built in Cleveland, Ohio 1871 by boat. She Sank in 33ft of water November 30, 1911 The Raleigh damaged her rudder in a severe storm, than ran aground and sank in the heavy seas with three lives lost.

The ship's boiler, engine room machinery, propeller, rudder, bow winch, and anchor remain.

## The Steel Products:

The 346 foot vessel was equipped with a crane and often carried scrap steel. After a long career she was taken under tow on October 26, 1961 to be scrapped at Dwor Metal Co. While anchored in heavy weather she slipped anchor on Oct. 28th and went aground. The decision was made to strip her in the spring so a crew of men were left on board for the winter. In the spring a road was built to her and the engines and part of her hull were removed. Being originally built in 1901 the remains left behind have been visible from the beach since. This wreck is very shallow with swimmers often climbing and jumping from the remains.
