

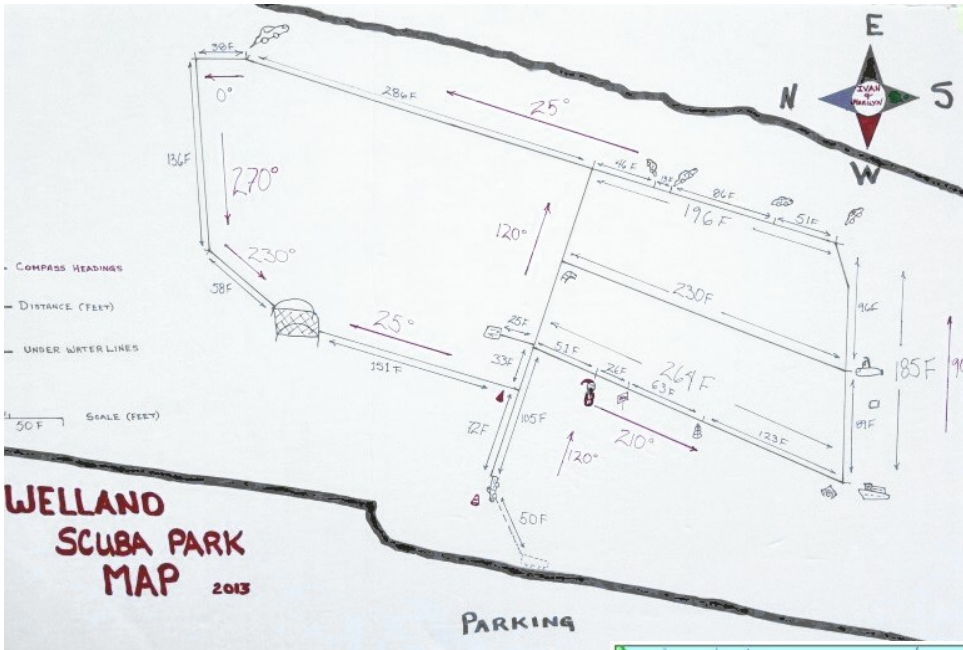
Welland Scuba Park / Swing Bridge

A good location for a day trip. Both dive sites are only 500m apart.

The Welland SCUBA Park is a portion of the old Welland Canal that got designated as a recreational dive site by the city of Welland. Among other things, there's a few sunken cars and a training platform, connected by guidelines.

There's free access and free parking. The site is also used for fishing and swimming, but is closed for boat traffic.

Visibility can be very good in early spring, but can be bad (almost zero) after rain. It is generally better at the swing bridge than at the park. With the bottom consisting of silt with some weeds.



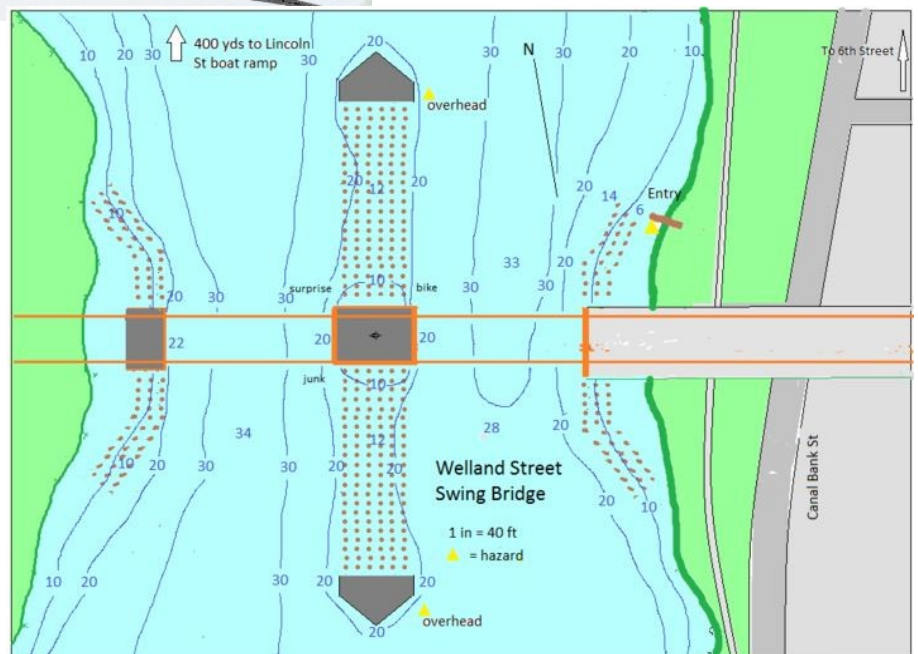
Access to the Scuba Park- parking lot is at 135 Lincoln St. Welland

You can easily follow the lines to find what has been placed. Find them by swimming over to Descend at the buoys, or swim out along the bottom and find the lines running parallel to the shore.

To dive the swing bridge,

You can swim the 400 yards from the scuba park or drive around and park on Canal Bank St.

The bank is very steep down to the water and not easily traveled when wet.
